Alternative Students Case-Study

1. Brief History #1

The Risk Factors - No parental involvement
- Low parental expectation
- Ineffective parenting

His mother viewed four-year-old boy as self-sufficient, but the boy has the feeling no one can be his friend. If someone becomes close to him, I suppose four-year-old boy will be like those guys. If those guys are bad, the boy may get the other risk factors from them because he is too immature.

I think he can be expected to stay on task in school if we replace him in the school/alternative school caring setting, and try to convince his mother to understand concerning the role of mother that is important to her son's progress in the school. The school and his mother must collaborate to help him into the right track; after that I believe he can also socialize appropriately with other children.

2. Brief History #2

The Risk Factors - Dysfunctional home-life (sees his mother beaten by his father)
- To be beaten by his father on occasion

In this case, we should remedy his psychological problem and also reassure him that his father would not beat him again. I recommend we should use the "wraparound program" and "long-term follow-up program", especially to try to stop his father's behavior. If the boy has the confidence that he will be not beaten again, he can happily stay on task in school and socialize with friends. Reading, writing and math can be a primary concern and also help him can survive from day to day the more pressing issue.

3. Brief History #3

The Risk Factors - Child is subject to family stressors
- Dysfunctional home-life

I am really sad that I know about her wicked experiences being raped by her father and her brother. She tries to seek someone who is her mother that she trust that can help her but she also is denied. At this time, the most significant need for her is love because she feels she has never got love from her family. Therefore, we should take her out of her family. I believe it is difficult that she will socialize with people or the students in the school or will have opportunity to be successful in school at this time. She may have a bad attitude regarding men and also believe everyone to be like her father and her brother.

4. Brief History #4

The Risk Factors - Low socioeconomic status
- Family earns little money

I can not guess whether the sugar feeding will matter for her health in the future. But I believe Jane's socialization with the other children and staying on task in school are

not too big problems to help if the main risk factor comes from only the family earning little money. In this case, I would like to recommend something about her parents' behavior. I think her parents should spend the money for something that is more necessary than the ornaments, like food. If it is possible, they should find a job to earn the money.
